Hinduism is the world's oldest religion, according to many scholars, with roots and customs dating back more than 4,000 years. Today, with more than <u>1 billion</u> <u>followers</u>, Hinduism is the third-largest religion worldwide, after <u>Christianity</u> and <u>Islam</u>. Roughly <u>94</u> <u>percent</u> of the world's Hindus live in India.

Hindus worship a number of different gods and minor deities, honor a range of symbols, respect several different holy books and celebrate with a wide variety of traditions, holidays and customs.

Key Beliefs

Hindu's have many beliefs but here are a few:

- a belief in many gods, which are seen as manifestations of a single unity. These
- deities are linked to universal and natural processes.
- a preference for one deity while not excluding or disbelieving others
- a belief in the universal law of cause and effect (karma) and reincarnation
- -a belief in the possibility of freedom and release (moksha) by which the endless cycle
- of birth, death, and rebirth (samsara) can be resolved.
