	Jesus	Christians believe Jesus is God's Son, part of the Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Messiah and The Saviour.
	Holy Communion	Holy Communion means, simply, 'togetherness' and this is a ritual to show the togetherness of Christians and God.
	rite of passage	A ceremony or event marking an important stage in someone's life
	Christian denominations	The various groups or branches within Christianity are referred to as denominations. Sometimes different Christian churches are also referred to as denominations.
	worship	Worship is any act that shows devotion to or love for God. Christians worship in many ways, including prayer, reading from the Holy Bible, attending the Eucharist and singing religious songs.
	communal	Communal means shared by all members of a community; for common use.
	Holy Bible	The Christian Bible is described: made up of 66 books, two 'Testaments' (39 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament). It's been translated into over 500 languages and over 5 billion copies have been sold: the best selling non- fiction book ever.
