Summary

The Great Fire of London started in a Bakery on Pudding Lane at 1 o'clock in the morning on 2nd September 1666. People had to flee their homes as more than 13,000 buildings were destroyed including churches and St Pauls Cathedral. The wind and dry weather contributed in the spread of the fire as it continued to burn across London for 5 days.
