

We are really excited to be starting a new year in the pond of possibilities! At the start of each half term, we will send out a newsletter to share everything your child will be learning about. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's teacher or one of the Early Years Team.

What are we learning about?

In Literacy, we will be learning the text 'The Three Bears and Three Pigs. The children will be focussing on a range of writing genres across the term, including: labels, speech bubbles,

lists, instructions and nonchronological reports.

In Mathematics, we will be learning to recognise numbers 10; matching the amount of objects to the correct digits. We will also be touching on repeating patterns with objects, subitizing and sorting into groups.

In Understanding of the World, we will be learning all about families and traditions. We will talk about who is in our families, where we live and our local area.

In Expressive Arts the children will be covering a wide range of skills to help develop fine and gross motor skills, through a use of tools

suitable for their age. They will be encouraged to use skills to paint and collage portraits. They will be working together to build straw, stick and brick houses.



Physical development will be covered in a range of aspects over the term, including: developing good coordination, completing dough disco to improve hand dexterity when writing . The children in Reception will also be learning how to get changed independently for their Friday PE Session.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

is intertwined throughout all aspects of our learning, where the children are encouraged to listen to others, take turns, to show sensitivity and respect for others. We will always encourage them to try new things, to help improve their confidence and talk about

feelings/behaviours in order to adapt to changes that may come their way.





The Characteristics of Effective Learning describe behaviours children use in order to learn. To learn well, children must approach opportunities with curiosity, energy and enthusiasm. Effective learning must be meaningful to a child, so that they are able to use what they have learned and apply it in new situations. These abilities and attitudes of strong learners will support them to learn well and make good progress in all the Areas of Learning and Development.

<u>What do we expect the children to</u> <u>do at home? (reception pupils)</u>

- Read at home at least three times per week.
 Children can read their reading book, or a book of their choice at home or from Bug Club.
- Big Talk homework will be sent home on a Wednesday and will need to be returned the following morning.
