What are we learning about?





LOUIS SACHAR In English, Sea Stars and Orcas will be reading There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom by Louis Sachar. Blue Whales will be

reading War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. We will be writing a biography and a narrative.

In Maths, we will be learning about the place value of 7-digit numbers and using formal methods to add and subtract.

In Science, we will be learning about Light. We will be learning how light appears to travel in straight lines. After which, we will explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them. We will also look in detail at the human eye and how we process light stimuli.

In Geography, we will be developing our map skills, focusing on the different features and four-figure grid references.


In History, Blue Whales will be deepening their understanding of the Ancient Greek era. Whereas, Orcas and Sea Stars will beginning their journey learning all about Ancient Greece. All

classes will be looking at the main events in this time period and how the society, settlements and artefacts tell us more about the past.

In Art, we will all be studying a key art movement—Pop Art, particularly focusing on the artists from this period and learning all about the techniques used to create engaging and emotive

pieces. Blue Whales will deepen their artistic skills whereas Orcas and Sea Stars will start their Pop Art journey from the beginning.
